- In **2015**, the **UN Security Council Resolution 2250** was unanimously adopted **addressing the causes of conflict**.

On 20th November 2020, history was made when ICGLR Heads of State declared to:

*“**Instruct** the [ICGLR] Secretariat to facilitate the establishment of a Regional Plan of Action on UN Security Council Resolution 2250 on Youth, Peace and Security in the Great Lakes Region;”*

As youth we accept and own our role and responsibilities to **shape this Regional Action Plan**.

In the words of the resolution, we bring our unique **Demographic Dividend** to contribute to **lasting peace and prosperity**.

By addressing root causes:

- Our governments identifying and addressing **exclusion** and **intolerance**
- We need **quality jobs**
- **Youth representation** in **decision-making** at local, national, regional and international levels
- **Participation** and **consultation** in negotiation **and** implementation of peace agreements
